New Classification Requirements

- District Director's Ratings – This counts 25 points of the overall classification rating. A rating of 0 through 5 is given by the District Director based upon the ratings in the AHSAA Official's Guide.
- District Camp Attendance – This counts as 5 points of the overall classification rating. This is added to the overall classification rating. This bonus for district camp attendance will remain in effect for 2 years.

New Classification Requirements

- Local Meeting Attendance – This counts 9 points of the overall classification rating. This is a percentage of association meetings. Association attendance will be verified by the District Directors at announced meetings. These meetings will be used for training purposes.

New Classification Requirements

- Classification Test Score – This counts 35 points of the overall classification rating. This is the score made on the classification test given each year. The latest classification score will be the one used. The classification test must be taken every 3 years. If no test taken, this will result in a zero for this part of the classification rating.

New Classification Requirements

- Years of Experience – This counts 10 points of the overall classification rating. This is a scale of years experience:
 - a. 1 – 4 years = 1 point
 - b. 5 – 8 years = 2 points
 - c. 9 – 12 years = 4 points
 - d. 13 – 16 years = 6 points
 - e. 17 – 20 years = 8 points
 - f. 21 and above = 10 points

New Classification Requirements

- Assignment Acceptance – This counts 5 points of the overall classification rating. This is a percentage of assigned games by the local association, accepted and officiated by the official.
- Coaches Ratings – This counts 3 points of the overall classification rating. This is an average of the ratings given by coaches throughout the year.

New Classification Requirements

- Local Association Ratings – This counts 3 points of the overall classification rating. A rating of 0 through 5 is given by the Local Association based upon the ratings in the AHSAA Official's Guide.
- Observer's Evaluation Ratings – This counts 5 points of the overall classification rating. This is an average of the ratings given by all observers.

BONUS OPPORTUNITIES:

- State Camp Attendance – This counts as a 4 point bonus of the overall classification rating. This is added to the overall classification rating. This bonus for state camp attendance will remain in effect for 5 years.
- State Office Ratings - This counts as a 3 points bonus of the overall classification rating. A rating of 0 through 5 is given by the State Office based upon the ratings in the AHSAA Official's Guide.

BONUS OPPORTUNITIES:

- Multiple Sport Officiating – This counts as a 2 points bonus of the overall classification rating. This is added to the overall classification rating. This bonus for multiple sport officiating will be applied to all sports worked by the official.
- Recruitment - This counts as a 3 points bonus of the overall classification rating. This is added to the overall classification rating. This bonus for each new official recruited for that school year up to 3 new officials. This bonus is good for one year.

BONUS OPPORTUNITIES:

- Mentor - This counts as a 3 points bonus of the overall classification rating. This is added to the overall classification rating. This bonus for each official that remains an official for 3 years (no more than 3 officials per year). This bonus remains in effect until the end of the 6th year that official remains active.

The classification scale is as follows:

- Class IV = 95 and above
- Class III = 85 to 94.9
- Class II = 75 to 84.9
- Class I = 74.9 and below

EXAMPLES:

- An official has the following:
 - District Director Rating – 4
 - District Camp Attendance – 5
 - Local Meeting Attendance – 60%
 - Classification Test Score – 80%
 - 7 Years of Experience
 - Assignment Acceptance – 85%
 - Coaches Rating – 3.4
 - Local Association Rating – 4
 - Observers Rating – 3

EXAMPLES:

- District Director Rating – 4 out of a possible 5. This is $4/5 = .8$ 25% of this is: $.8 \times .25 = .20$ To get this to 100 scale: $.20 \times 100 = 20$. So, a 4 rating would give **20** points out of 25.

EXAMPLES:

- District Director Rating – 4 out of 5. $4/5 \times .25 \times 100 = 20$
- District Camp Attendance – $5 = 5.0$
- Local Meeting Attendance – $.6 \times .09 \times 100 = 5.4$
- Classification Test Score – $.8 \times .35 \times 100 = 28.0$
- Years of Experience – 5 - 8 years = 2.0
- Assignment Acceptance – $.85 \times .05 \times 100 = 4.25$
- Coaches Rating – 3.4 out of 5. $3.4/5 \times .03 \times 100 = 2.04$

EXAMPLES:

- Local Association Rating – 4 out of 5. $4/5 \times .03 \times 100 = 4.0$
- Observers Rating – 3 out of 5. $3/5 \times .05 \times 100 = 1.8$
- *Total: $20 + 5.0 + 5.4 + 28 + 2.0 + 4.25 + 2.04 + 4.0 + 1.8 = 72.49$*

Example 2:

- An official has the following:
 - District Director Rating – 4
 - District Camp Attendance – 5
 - Local Meeting Attendance – 60%
 - Classification Test Score – 80%
 - 7 Years of Experience
 - Assignment Acceptance – 85%
 - Coaches Rating – 3.4
 - Local Association Rating – 4
 - Observers Rating – 3

Example 2:

- District Director Rating – 4 out of a possible 5. This is $4/5 = .8$ 25% of this is: $.8 \times .25 = .20$ To get this to 100 scale: $.20 \times 100 = 20$. So, a 4 rating would give **20** points out of 25.

Example 2:

- District Director Rating – 4 out of 5. $4/5 \times .25 \times 100 = 20$
- District Camp Attendance – $5 = 5.0$
- Local Meeting Attendance – $.6 \times .09 \times 100 = 5.4$
- Classification Test Score – $.8 \times .35 \times 100 = 28.0$
- Years of Experience – $5 - 8 \text{ years} = 2.0$
- Assignment Acceptance – $.85 \times .05 \times 100 = 4.25$
- Coaches Rating – 3.4 out of 5. $3.4/5 \times .03 \times 100 = 2.04$

Example 2:

- Local Association Rating – 4 out of 5. $\frac{4}{5} \times .03 \times 100 = 4.0$
- Observers Rating – 3 out of 5. $\frac{3}{5} \times .05 \times 100 = 1.8$
- *Total: $20 + 5.0 + 5.4 + 28 + 2.0 + 4.25 + 2.04 + 4.0 + 1.8 = 72.49$*

Bonuses:

- State Camp Attendance 2 years ago – 4
- State Office Rating – 3
- Calls Football and Baseball – 2 (for football and baseball)
- Recruits 3 new officials for the current school year – 2
- A previously recruited official remains for 4 years - 1

Bonus Points:

- State Camp Attendance – 2 = **2.0**
- State Office Rating – 3 out of 5. $3/5 \times .03 \times 100 = 1.8$
- Multiple Sport Officiating – 2 = **2.0**
- Recruitment – 2 = **3.0**
- Mentor – 1 = **1.0**

Bonus Points:

- *Total: $20 + 5.0 + 5.4 + 28 + 2.0 + 4.25 + 2.04 + 4.0 + 1.8 + 2.0 + 1.8 + 2.0 + 3.0 + 1.0 = 82.29$*
